After those first few days of getting caught up, I did enjoy an extended break. I was ready to come back, however. I enjoy what I do and I missed seeing students, parents and staff members. I assume that can be interpreted to mean that I am not ready to retire. I'm fortunate to have a job I enjoy.

Now that we are well into winter, I want to remind you that we are likely to see school closings due to inclement weather. School closings are announced on the TPS website, TPS Facebook page and most media outlets. The fastest way to receive updates is through the School Way app, which you can download from www.tulsaschools.org/app. Messages from School Way are instantly delivered to your phone.

I am sure that most of you are aware of the \$47 million dollars in cuts to education. These cuts, announced by the State Department of Education, are for the remainder of the school year. The "revenue failure" can be attributed to the effects of recent budget cuts and the decline in oil prices. I am sure there are other factors as well. This is an issue for our state government. We are left to deal with the consequences.

It would be premature for me to speculate how these cuts will affect Mayo. Our superintendent, Dr. Gist, and the school board will decide how to balance the budget despite these mid-year cuts. I am confident that they will protect school sites and classrooms as much as possible. However, you should be aware that we are also expecting additional cuts this year. More importantly, we expect to see significant cuts to the budget for next school year. It is likely that we will see an increase in class sizes, which may result in the loss of classroom teachers. We won't have that information until later in the year, but I want you to be aware of the possibility.

I hesitate to provide this information, but I want to provide you with a concrete example of the effect of increased class sizes. The 2015-2016 staffing allocation includes a ratio of one teacher for twenty-three students in grades 1-3. The total number of students in a grade is divided by twenty-three to determine how many teachers would be allocated.

If the teacher/student ration remains at 23:1:

46 students divided by 23 2 teachers Class size of 23
57 students divided by 23 2.47 teachers (rounded down to 2) Class size of 28/29
58 students divided by 23 2.52 teachers (rounded up to 3) Class size of 19/20
62 students divided by 23 2.69 teachers (rounded up to 3) Class size of 20/21

If the teacher/student ratio is raised to 25:1:

46 students divided by 25
1.84 teachers (rounded up 2)
Class size of 23
57 students divided by 25
2.28 teachers (rounded down to 2)
Class size of 28/29
58 students divided by 25
2.32 teachers (rounded down to 2)
Class size of 29
62 students divided by 25
2.48 teachers (rounded down to 2)
Class size of 31

I want to make it clear that I have no information that suggests this will happen. I know that our school board will do everything it can to protect class sizes. The impending cuts, however, may leave them few options for next year. I simply want to demonstrate how a generic, politically neutral headline of "Revenue Failure" can be translated. The "revenue failure" is real. The cuts are real. The effect will be real. Your vote matters. Your involvement matters. Your voice matters.

And now, I will gently step down off of my soap box so I won't reinjure my foot.
